



## Pick and Mix Home Learning

Alongside our usual homework expectations around daily reading, spellings practice and learning number facts (number bonds and times tables), we would also like to encourage the children to engage with our wider topic at home. ### Year 3/4 – Autumn 2 What have The Romans Ever Done for Us?



<u>Roman Timeline</u>  Make a timeline to show important events in Roman history.	<u>Roman Diary</u>  Imagine you are a Roman citizen or soldier. Write a diary entry about a day or event in your life.	<u>Roman Collage or Mosaic</u>  Choose a person or event from Roman times and create a collage or mosaic to depict them/it.
<u>Roman Armoury</u>  Design and make a Roman Shield and or sword.	<u>Roman Emperors</u>  Choose a Roman Emperor. Research their life and write a biography about them.	<u>Roman Scene</u>  Use paint, crayons or other methods to create a picture of a Roman scene or event.
<u>Roman Costume</u>  Design or make a Roman outfit. Dress a doll or soft toy in the outfit.	<u>Roman Chariots</u>  Draw, make or describe a Roman Chariot.	<u>Roman Gods and Goddesses</u>  Draw a picture, write a description or make a poster about a Roman God or Goddess.
<u>Roman Buildings</u>  Find out about a Roman building and make a model of it.	<u>Aqueducts/Roads/Place Names</u>  Research aqueducts/Roman roads/place names. How and why were they made? Where in Britain could you find an aqueduct/Roman road/town or city?	<u>Roman Food</u>  Research what the Romans would have eaten. Create a menu for a Roman banquet.

The above are suggested ideas. You might be able to think of alternative activities.
