

Curriculum Overview Term 2 – November 2022 Kestrel, Osprey and Falcon Classes- Year 5/6



Dear Parents/ Carers

Welcome back. Term 1 has flown by and we are already into our second term! The children made a brilliant start to the year last term and we are looking forward to building on our learning as we move forward through the year.

## <u>Topic</u>

This term we are kicking off with an exciting entrepreneurial project. The children are working in groups to design, make and present an invention in response to a problem they have identified. They have been working brilliantly to evolve their ideas and think about the necessary features. The children will be pitching their ideas to a panel with the winning idea being recorded to be entered into a National final in December.

We will then be starting a Technology unit using textiles, thinking about how we can join materials to create a stuffed toy.

Later in the term we will be moving on to a science unit of work looking at living things and their habitats. We will be exploring the lifecycles of different plants and animals and researching the contribution individuals have made to scientific discovery by looking at people such as Jane Goodall and David Attenborough.

In our English, we will be focusing on the text, The Nowhere Emporium by Ross MacKenzie. We will be thinking about themes and conventions, exploring what makes this a fantasy story. In our writing we will be using the book to write our own suspense narratives before looking into writing a biography for one of the characters.

# **Reading**

Reading is an essential part of the children's learning and we cannot stress enough how beneficial it is for the children to be reading regularly at home. Children in Upper Key Stage Two are encouraged to develop stamina in reading. We will ensure that the book children are reading is appropriately pitched for their ability (whether this is a book they have borrowed from school or a book they are reading from home) and they are encouraged to read whole texts rather than flitting between books. This will enable them to develop their stamina in reading and understanding of character and plot development. If children would like to read other books or texts (including newspapers, magazines and comics) in addition to their reading book, then we encourage this but they may need to share these with an adult if they are beyond their capability.

## **Expectations and responsibilities**

<u>PE Kit</u>

This year, children are expected to bring their PE kits in to school ready for PE sessions. PE sessions will be held on the days stated below; however, there will be occasions where we will need to be flexible so please ensure your child has their PE kit available in school every day.

PE kit should consist of black shorts or jogging bottoms, their house coloured plain t-shirt and their school jumper.

## Stationery and other personal belongings
