

Curriculum Overview Term 3 – January 2023 Kestrel, Osprey and Falcon Classes- Year 5/6



Dear Parents/ Carers

Happy New Year to you all and we hope you had a wonderful Christmas break. We are looking forward to another jam packed term full of exciting learning opportunities.

<u>Topic</u>

Our topic learning for this term centres around the enquiry question 'How did the Ancient civilisations leave their mark on Wiltshire?' We will be playing archaeologists and exploring nearly 10,000 years of history as we journey through the Stone Age to the Iron Age. We will find out how everyday life changed for these civilisations and use evidence to build up a picture of a key figure. We will be discovering the significance of various local landmarks including Stonehenge and The Avebury Stone Circle.

Our English this term will be based on the fabulous Goodnight Mister Tom by Michelle Magorian. This heartwrenching tale tells the story of William Beech who is evacuated during World War Two to the tiny village of Little Weirwold to live with grumpy Mister Tom Oakley. As well as exploring the complex character development throughout the story we will be using the text as a stimulus for our writing where we will be exploring the genre of newspaper reports and narrative description. This book is a firm favourite and we look forward to exploring the text with the children.

Reading

Reading is an essential part of the children's learning and we cannot stress enough how beneficial it is for the children to be reading regularly at home. Children in Upper Key Stage Two are encouraged to develop stamina in reading. We will ensure that the book children are reading is appropriately pitched for their ability (whether this is a book they have borrowed from school or a book they are reading from home) and they are encouraged to read whole texts rather than flitting between books. This will enable them to develop their stamina in reading and understanding of character and plot development. <u>PE Kit</u>
