Kestrel, Osprey and Falcon

Dear Parents/ Carers

Welcome back to a brand new Term. We hope you had a wonderful half-term break. We are looking forward to another jam packed term full of exciting learning opportunities.

Topic

Our topic learning for this term centres around the geographical enquiry question: Where in the world is Trowbridge? Our focus will be on Trowbridge, where we are in the World and how we connect to other places, both in the UK and abroad. We will be exploring the regions and counties of the UK, developing our locational knowledge and ability to use a range of maps, including digital maps. We plan to investigate how Trowbridge may change in the future and what amenities our local community would like to see develop. In DT, we will be sampling a range of pizzas, conducting surveys into consumers' views and making our own, too! In Science and PSHE, we will be studying healthy lifestyle choices and how exercise impacts our physical and mental wellbeing.

During Book Week, we will be exploring Shakespeare's Macbeth. We will be recreating key scenes and writing in different genres based on the play.

Our English this term will continue to be based on the fabulous Goodnight Mister Tom by Michelle Magorian. This heart-wrenching tale tells the story of William Beech who is evacuated during World War Two to the tiny village of Little Weirwold to live with grumpy Mister Tom Oakley. As well as exploring the complex character development throughout the story we will be using the text as a stimulus for our writing where we will be exploring narrative settings. This book is a firm favourite and we look forward to exploring the text with the children.

SATs preparation

As you are probably aware, in term 5 (week commencing 8th May) the year 6 children will be taking their Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs). This is a measure of how much they have progressed throughout the school in reading, grammar and maths. This only gives a very small snapshot of the talents and skills that these amazing children possess; it *does not* show off their wonderful skills in art, or their amazing knowledge of the world around them. Neither does it measure how kind, empathetic or resilient they can be. We absolutely do not want the children to feel under pressure and feel stressed about their performance in these tests but we do want them to feel prepared and confident as they move forward towards secondary school and proud of the progress they have made during their time at Paxcroft.

A number of parents have asked about revision guides for children to complete extra work at home. Although we may send out some additional tasks based on areas where they may feel less confident, we will not be sending home revision books. If you would like to purchase your own guides, then take a look at the CGP website where they sell books for the end of KS2 tests. Please do not feel under any obligation to purchase these. Keep up the use of the online programmes for learning - mathletics, spellingframe and TT rockstars — they are brilliant resources to help consolidate what the children are doing in class. Please make sure they are recording the work they are doing in your green homework diaries so that we can celebrate this in school.

Reading

Reading is an essential part of the children's learning and we cannot stress enough how beneficial it is for the children to be reading regularly at home. Children in Upper Key Stage Two are encouraged to develop stamina in reading. We will ensure that the book children are reading is appropriately pitched for their ability (whether this is a book they have borrowed from school or a book they are reading from home) and they are encouraged to read whole texts rather than flitting between books. This will enable them to develop their stamina in reading and understanding of character and plot development. PE Kit
