


Curriculum Overview Term 6 – June 2023 **Kestrel, Osprey and Falcon**





Dear Parents/ Carers

Welcome back to our final term of the year. We cannot believe how quickly the year has gone. It has already been a very busy start to the term with Year 6 off on their residential at Mill on the Brue last week, and there are lots of other exciting events happening to finish our year.

Topic

This term we are travelling back to Ancient Greece to find out what legacy they left behind. We will be finding out what made them such a strong civilisation and looking into some of the key Greek figures who have made an impact on our world. We will be role playing life in different city states to compare and contrast lifestyles. We will use primary sources to explore the Ancient Olympic Games before creating our own pottery depicting scenes from the Games. Through our Design Technology unit, we will be investigating Greek architecture and structures before looking in more depth at how to build a bridge using different strengthening techniques.

Our English this term will be based on various Greek Myths, in particular the Labours of Heracles. We will explore features of Greek myths before creating our own mythical creatures and heroes to write our own. Our shared class text will be Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief where we will be exploring characterisation and themes.

Home Learning

It is still essential that the children are completing home learning tasks in order to consolidate their learning. Spellings will continue to be sent home on a Friday for the following week. We recommend that the children spend a short amount of time each day practising these. Please make sure that the homework diaries are filled in to show what the children have done at home so this can be celebrated.

Reading

We cannot stress enough how important it is that the children are reading regularly at home. Whilst independent reading is important, it is still beneficial for the children to be sharing books with an adult so that they can discuss unfamiliar language and events in the text. Please encourage your children to read whole texts rather than swapping and changing from book to book as this helps to develop their understanding of themes and plot development.
