

Dear Parents/Carers ...

This has been another productive and busy week at Paxcroft.

Miss Beaven and I worked with a specialist phonics teacher from Ramsbury English Hub. Across Reception and KS1 classes, we observed phonics lessons, interventions and 1:1 reading sessions, with coaching sessions provided for staff. I am pleased to report that feedback from this evaluation visit was very positive.

Staff also participated in a training session led by colleagues from the Behaviour Support Service to develop knowledge and understanding of ways to positively manage and support children's social, emotional and mental health needs.

Yesterday Mr George and Mrs Brown met with Wiltshire Council Safeguarding Lead to review current school processes and procedures in place to ensure all our children are safe. This included meeting with children and staff. Again, feedback was positive.

This week's curriculum has certainly been broad and engaging (and a bit wet and muddy!) with all children from Year 1 –Year 6 enjoying their outdoor learning days, led by Wiltshire Wildlife Trust. Here are some of the children's comments:

'My favourite thing today was building animal houses and dens' - Matilda

'I enjoyed making clay outside it was so much fun' - Louis

'The best thing about outdoor learning is getting muddy and having fun with nature' - Buddie

Throughout the week, the children have learned about the meaning and significance of Remembrance Day. On Wednesday, I accompanied Lucy and Theo, two of our school councillors, on a visit to meet some of the residents at a local nursing home. The residents shared their experiences of wartime.

"We talked to Dorothy who shared her experience of being a World War II evacuee, travelling by train with her brother and sister from London to Yorkshire. It was inspiring and I loved it." Lucy, School Council

Each child in the school made their own individual poppy and we used these to create a giant Paxcroft Poppy of Remembrance in the hall. The school held a 2-minute silence as a mark of respect.

Our learning this week

Owls

This week in Owls we have had great fun continuing with our superhero topic. In Literacy, we have read the story 'Superworm' and worked hard on writing a sentence to describe him. In Maths, we have been comparing objects using the language, more and less. We had great fun yesterday using our maths skills in investigation to make a repeating pattern with natural objects. In our outdoor provision we have had great fun making superhero obstacle courses.

Year 1 and Year 2 have been very busy this week! We had our outdoor learning day with lots of fun activities. The children enjoyed pretending to be squirrels for the morning as they collected pinecones and squirreled them away for the winter. They then came back later and tried to remember where they had hidden their pinecones. We now know how difficult it would be for squirrels to find their acorns after hibernating! Children were given lots of adjectives and had to collect different items for each word. Once they had found these items, they then swapped them with another group and tried to work out which item went with which word. In the afternoon, children built dens out of sticks, tarpaulins and ropes and hunted for bugs. They used charts to identify what bugs they found and carefully placed them back where they had found them. During our RE day this week, we learnt about why we celebrate special times. We focussed on Christmas by discussing what Christmas looks like for different people, how Christians celebrate it and the importance of the Nativity Story.


In Year 5/6 we have had a varied and lively week. This is the week we commemorate the Festival of Remembrance and reflect on the sacrifices made by so many during WW1 and subsequently in various conflicts. We have been reading some war poetry – both modern and from the time and reflecting on these. On Friday we will be joining the rest of the school to lay our poppies in our Remembrance Commemoration. This week, too, is UK parliament Week. The children have been learning about the mechanisms of government, including how Parliament functions. We have discussed the Monarch's role within Government and watched part of the King's Opening of Parliament speech. We have been thinking about Democracy and the hallmarks of democratic countries such as: Freedom of speech, Equal rights, Free and fair elections and the free press amongst others.

We had our second R.E day on Wednesday, in which we investigated the deeper meaning of various festivals, ranging from Christmas to why the Langar exists in Sikh temples. We also had our first outdoor learning day of the year, which the children thoroughly enjoyed. We took part in a range of outdoor activities.


