Our learning this week ...

Wren & Robin

This week has been another week of firsts for Robin and Wren and we are very impressed with how the children are embracing the new challenges. We had our first session of PE and we were very impressed with the way the children got changed. The children had great fun in the hall moving around in different ways and learning what finding a space means. We started our Sounds write sessions on Tuesday and the children have been learning letter sounds and how

to blend these sounds to read words. They have also been sharing picture books and have brought these home to enjoy with you. These are picture books for the children (and parents) to use their imagination and tell their own stories and develop their vocabulary. We hope you enjoy sharing these together. Finally we have learnt a new word in Maths; Subitise. This is where we are learning to recognise small amounts without needing to count them. What a busy week we have had!

Woodpecker, Kingfisher & Nightingale

This week in Nightingale, Kingfisher and Woodpecker, we have continued to learn about the continents and have found out more about South America, Asia and Europe. In our English lessons, we have investigated ways of making stories more interesting by using story language and adjectives and we have used these ideas to start planning an innovation for 'The Storm Whale' text. For Maths, the Year 1 objectives have been to count and represent objects to 10 and the Year 2 objectives have been identifying tens and ones and using a Place Value chart. We have continued with our Sounds-Write lessons and the children are excited to bring home a book to read over the next week.



Skylark, Housemartin, Swift

This week the children have continued to develop their understanding of Place Value, so they should be able to tell you the value of the digit 4 in the number 247 (let us know if they can't!) We have been developing our story writer's toolbox this week, by focussing on developing vivid settings for our stories and interesting characters to include when we write the completed story next week. Science this term is all about the body, so you could well have heard the names of lots of different bones being used. Ask them how their skeleton moves – they should be able to tell you that muscles contract and relax to move our bodies around. We've also been learning about our digestive systems. Apologies if they choose to tell you all about this at the dinner table!

Osprey, Falcon & Kestrel

This has been a very significant week in our country's history and we have spent time reflecting on the contribution the late Queen has made to the Country through her long reign. We have also been reflecting on how much our country has changed in so many ways through her lifetime. The children have impressed us with their reflection and general knowledge.

In our topic lessons this week we have been learning about the Blitz and what life on the Home Front looked like. We have been examining original sources, including contemporary recordings by British and then, neutral reporters about the Blitz and watched a short film about how 'London could take it'. We have been investigating rationing, using the Internet to research wartime recipes and subsequently planned meals for a family. We also have looked at how civilians took on extra roles during this difficult time and how the roles of women changed.

In Guided Reading, we have been reading a biography of Nelson Mandela, to vary our reading diet. In English, we have been analysing the structural and linguistic features of discussion texts. In Maths we are extending our knowledge of numbers and the number system to 10 000 000 (y6), partitioning numbers and stating the values of each digit.


