We are seeking Midday Supervisory Assistants to join our friendly school team. The role involves a mixture of supervision of children in the lunch hall and encouraging happy, positive play on the playgrounds (and occasionally in classrooms if it is too wet for outside play.)

This week the children have had great fun inventing their own super hero passports. They have decided on their name, what they look like and what super power they have! We have been impressed with the children's writing. We can really see the children starting to use the skills they have been developing in our Sounds Write sessions. We also started our Science unit on seasonal changes, we have set up a weather experiment where we will be checking the amount of rain fall and temperature over the next 4 weeks. We also had an RE day where we were looking at inspirational people, we had great fun having a go at a trust fall with the friends we trust.



In maths, we have continued to expand our understanding of multiplication and division. Our History learning had us looking into why Britain was invaded.


