She has led lots of wonderful Key Stage 1 productions, and, as Music Leader, has taken children to London and Birmingham to take part in the Young Voices singing event, and to perform a special concert for the Mayor of Trowbridge. As Early Reading Leader, she has also overseen the introduction of the school's phonics programme, supporting and coaching colleagues to develop children's early reading and writing skills.

'My happiest moments have been Young Voices, the Music Festivals and drama productions because I love seeing the joy on the children's faces and how proud they are of themselves and their performances. These events always made me feel emotional and I felt honoured that I taught such amazing children at Paxcroft and that I could share those parts of their primary school journey.'

Mrs Rigby and Mrs Dennett

Mrs Rigby joined the school in 2009. She has taught and nurtured the children in Year 5/6 over many years, preparing them for successful transition to secondary school. She has led many residential trips to Mill on the Brue Activity centre, providing the children with wonderful experiences and memories that they will carry with them. She has always set a high marker for the end of year drama production, most recently the wonderful performance of Aladdin. As English Leader, she has developed the school's reading, writing and spelling curriculum, introducing a 'reading spine' of high quality, wide-ranging books to help engage and inspire the children. She recently trained as a Key Stage 2 writing moderator and has been a long-term staff governor.

'I vividly remember a trip Mrs Young and I went on to Warwick Castle during our medieval topic. Possibly the wettest day of the year – we got absolutely soaked but it was a great day. Everybody in wellies and waterproofs and one little girl arrives at school in her little pumps and carrying a handbag! I also remember when all the teachers dressed as Where's Wally for World Book Day and, along with Mrs Brooks and Mrs Young, sneaking up to Mr Caldwell's Cross Country club and hiding in various places so the children could play Where's Wally. Another memory would be dressing up as Will-I-Am to be a judge for Paxfactor alongside Mrs Dennett as Darcy Bussell and Miss Heathcote. Of course there are also many memories of valuable learning experiences too!!' Mrs Rigby

Joining the Paxcroft teaching team in 2016, Mrs Dennett has taught and supported classes of children across Year 3/4 and Year 5/6. She has enthusiastically promoted sport and outdoor learning opportunities, leading various sports activities for the children, including our teams of performers at West Wilts Dance Festival. She has led the Year 4 residential trip to Braeside, always encouraging children to embrace a new challenge and develop a growth mindset. More recently, as Maths Leader, she has developed the curriculum to support our youngest children gaining a secure understanding of number and place value, including the use of manipulatives.

'Too many memories to count: performances with Mrs Rigby, Mrs Young and Miss Parkes, Paxfactor, evenings out with our lovely staff team, my Friday walks with Miss Parkes, Miss Stephens and Miss Beaven. One of my favourite memories was when all the staff were trying to put staff acts together for Paxfactor and Mrs Young and I tried to see how many Maltesers we could throw into each other's mouths in a minute.
