

Dear Parents/Carers

This week our specialist phonics teacher from Ramsbury English Hub visited to observe Sounds-Write phonics sessions in Reception and Year 1/2 classes. High quality teaching of phonics is one of our school improvement priorities this academic year and I am pleased to report that we are making positive progress.

From time to time, we know that children have worries or concerns and we work hard in school to provide children with any emotional support needed. They are encouraged to share worries with staff, including our Pastoral Support team. We understand that some children may find this hard to do. With this in mind, this year we introduced a 'what I want my teacher to know' box in each classroom so that children can write down any worries (or good news) that they want to share. In addition, on Wednesday a group of 12 children from Year 4 and Year 5 participated in a training workshop led by Richard Pomfrett from the Stay Safe Initiative. These children are taking on a new role as 'Paxcroft Mentors' and will be available to provide support for other children across the school if they have worries or concerns. They have been chosen as positive role models.

Next week we are looking forward to the Year 3.4 performances of 'Alice the Musical' and our Outdoor Learning Days led by Wiltshire Wildlife Trust. On these Outdoor days, please send your child to school with appropriate clothes/footwear and a waterproof coat. You will find more details in the diary section of this newsletter.

Our Learning this week

Owls

This week in Owls Class, we have been looking at the story 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. In Literacy, we have been pretending to be Goldilocks and have written letters to the three bears saying sorry for all the naughty things we did in their cottage. The children have loved putting their imagination hats on and getting into character to do this. In Maths, we have been learning about odd and even numbers, maybe you can ask your child at home what they are. In PE this week, we had great fun doing some relaxing Yoga but also jumping and dancing around to Kids Zumba's. Our favourite one was the Minions!

This week, KS1 have continued to learn about measuring objects in centimetres and metres. Year 2 have also been comparing and ordering lengths and heights. In English, children have been focusing on developing and applying the skills needed to write a letter recount. They have learnt all about coordinating and subordinating conjunctions and writing in the past tense. In DT this week, children have used a template to create a design for their puppets. They have also cut their two pieces of fabric out for their puppets and explored ways to join these together ready to decorate next week!

We are very impressed with how dedicated to the play the children have been, their hard work has not gone unnoticed. We have been coming to an end of our fractions unit in Maths and continued our biography learning in English, where we have focussed on David Attenborough. This has been another busy week in Year 5/6. In Music, this term we have been learning a song and a dance 'Flash Mob' routine, which the children thoroughly enjoyed performing in the playground today. In Maths, we have been finding the perimeters and areas of rectangles and rectilinear shapes. Year 6 have also learned how to find the area of triangles. In English, we have boxed up a model explanation text and analysed the features of this genre before practising writing the different sections. We are really enjoying reading Stormbreaker and following Alex's adventures. In DT, we have practised making different levers and spacers for our project. On Thursday, Year 6 walked to St James' Church for the Easter Experience, where the children learned about the most significant events of Holy Week. We were very proud of the way the children represented the school.

Y6 Secondary Transition ...

Earlier this month, our Year 6 pupils found out where they will be heading to Secondary School in September 2024. Every year, as part of the transition arrangements, key members of staff from the receiving Secondary Schools come to Paxcroft to meet their new students and to discuss pupils with the Year 6 teachers. We have arranged an additional visit from the Heads of Year 7 as a response to some of our pupils expressing some anxiety about the move. This year, the secondary schools have collaborated to produce a 'Secondary Ready Video' which you can access via the link below. This is a great initiative and hopefully one that will help relieve some of the anxiety or nerves around transition. We will also be showing the video in a PSHE session.
