The team will be available to support all families with a wide range of needs to ensure the happiness and safety of every child. Our Pastoral Team includes:

#### Mrs Jackie Evans - Pastoral Support Advisor

Jackie will be the first point of contact for parents/carers and assist in establishing good relationships with children, parents and carers; providing advice, guidance and support to children in their personal, social and emotional development.

Jackie will provide pastoral support to children, predominately those identified with higher needs and children experiencing difficulties on a day-to-day basis.

#### Mrs Claire Jessup - ELSA

Claire is an Emotional Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA), who has a wealth of experience of working with children and wants to help your child feel happy in school, to enable them to reach their potential educationally. Claire's aim is to remove the barriers to learning and to have happy children in school and at home. ELSA sessions are planned and designed to be interactive and fun, addressing any social or emotional issues they may be facing. Access and referrals for ELSA are completed by the Class Teachers, which helps to provide a focus to the sessions and support your child in school more effectively. #### Mrs Maggie Williams - Parent Support Advisor

#### Owls


